Did you know that the European Union is made up of 27 countries and has a population of about 447 million?

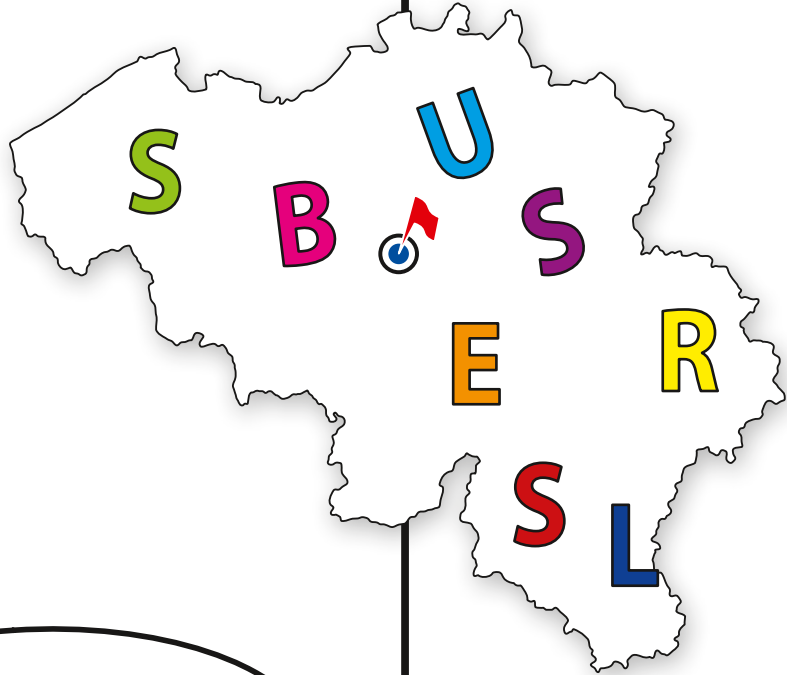
Come and discover these 27 countries, colour in their flags and guess the names of their capitals from the letters that have been jumbled up.
